Ridgy-didge new suburb

FORGET the new letterbox. A new postcode is in the mail for residents of Melbourne's newest suburb.

The City of Casey and Botanic Ridge Estate developers Leederville recently announced Botanic Ridge as the latest stand-alone suburb to be officially gazetted by the Victorian Register of Geographic Names.

In one of the state's fastest-growing areas, the new suburb is designed to provide environmentally sensitive

housing close to Cranbourne Royal Botanic Gardens.

Leederville director **Sean Delaney** says: "The new suburb will not only encompass the existing Botanic Ridge residential development but the surrounds that capture the botanic feel of this location."

Close to schools, Cranbourne town centre, Casey Fields and the City of Casey's new \$37 million aquatic and leisure centre, Botanic Ridge is expected to house 11,500 residents on completion.
